CEO Chris Grice discussed NSA advocacy for seniors in relevant areas, and NSA input into our Federal Budget priorities.

Board members and senior staff of National Seniors Australia have taken their advocacy on your behalf direct to Parliament House, and spoke to Parliamentary Friends of Seniors (a nonpartisan group of MPs and Senators) Mr Grice used the Canberra gathering to draw attention to National Seniors' 2024 Federal Pre-Budget Submission, which "puts forward recommendations around cost of living, housing and health that provide direct relief coupled with longer-term policy reform to ensure we maintain our standard of living". Also of interest was the mention of Everald Compton, founder of NSA, who was part of the group.


A Wander Down Wickham Street




WHAT ABOUT SAL


